SUITE OF FALL EXHIBITIONS AT WEXNER CENTER OFFERS REFLECTION, HUMOR, SPECTACLE

Columbus, OH—The Wexner Center for the Arts presents three exhibitions this fall, all of which reflect off of each other in various ways:

- ***Shiny***, a bright, playful exhibition of works with reflective, mirrored surfaces, featuring such artists as Andy Warhol and Jeff Koons, and seven others.
- ***Twice Untitled and Other Pictures (looking back)***, the first U.S. museum survey of the work of influential American artist **Louise Lawler**.
- ***Frank Stella 1958***, the only Midwestern stop on a national tour of this exhibition, which looks at a single year in the career of this revered artist.

Notes Wexner Center Director Sherri Geldin, "This suite of exhibitions was conceived to appeal to the first-time gallery visitor as well as the art aficionado. Rarely seen early works by now legendary master Frank Stella, along with a dazzling and highly reflective array of work by younger generations, bookend a retrospective of seminal American artist Louise Lawler, whose decades-long career explores the very nature of experiencing works of art. For astute and inquisitive viewers, an uncanny web of connections and references across the three exhibitions will add to the richness of their visit."

"But regardless of one's familiarity with art history, these three exhibitions promise a spectacular and surprising presentation of work by the leading artists of the past 50 years."

All exhibitions run **September 16–December 31, 2006** at the Wexner Center for the Arts (with a public preview party on September 15). **Gallery admission is free**. A **reading lounge** with catalogues and other materials relating to the three exhibitions will be set up in the galleries.
