ABOUT NATALIE COLE

Daughter of the legendary Nat "King" Cole, Natalie Cole rocketed to stardom in 1975 with her debut album, *Inseparable*, and her #1 single, "This Will Be (An Everlasting Love)," earning her Grammy Awards for Best New Artist and Best Female R&B Vocal Performance. After a string of hit singles throughout the 1970s and 1980s, 1991 brought *Unforgettable...With Love*, an album of standards including the "Unforgettable" duet with her late father, which spent five weeks at #1 on the pop charts, earned six Grammy Awards (including Song, Record, and Album of the Year), and sold more than 14 million copies worldwide.

While recording 2008's Still Unforgettable (another Grammy winner), Cole was diagnosed with hepatitis C during a routine examination, having probably contracted the infection as the result of drug use many decades before. The following years saw her undergo extensive chemotherapy, dialysis, and, eventually, a kidney transplant. November 2010 brought the release of Cole's memoir, Love Brought Me Back, a story of loss and recovery, sorrow and joy, success and despair, and, finally, success again. She is releasing an album of brand new material in spring 2013.


2013 STAR AWARD HONOREES

ANDREW THOMAS, MD, MBA, FACP

Dr. Andrew Thomas is an associate professor of clinical internal medicine at The Ohio State University College of Medicine and serves as the medical director for Ohio State University Hospital. After completing his undergraduate degree at Harvard University (1991), this Ohio native returned to his roots and completed both his medical education (1995) and residency (1998) at Ohio State. He was recruited to join the faculty and subsequently selected for the first fellowship in the Quality Enhancement Program.

During a two-year Quality Improvement Fellowship, he also completed a master's degree in business administration at Ohio State's Fisher College of Business (2000).

The mentoring of Dr. Hagop Mekhjian fostered Dr. Thomas's passion for both quality and safety in patient care. Shortly after completing his fellowship, he merged that passion with that of graduate medical education and gave leadership to that program for over a decade. Dr. Thomas is a leader in quality and patient safety initiatives at the regional and state level. He has represented Ohio State in the Central Ohio Hospital Quality Collaborative since it was first formed in 2002. He was also a founding member and past Chair of the Board of the Ohio Patient Safety Institute. Dr. Thomas has been a strong supporter of the STAR Program and his vision and contributions have been invaluable.



LEE S. SZYKOWNY, MD

Lee Szykowny graduated from Williams College and then earned her medical degree at The Ohio State University. She completed residencies there in adult and child psychiatry. Upon beginning a community practice she joined the Netcare Board and was struck by the enormity of need for mental health care in the central Ohio community and the unique demands placed on caregivers by people in crisis.

In 2004 Dr. Szykowny joined the OSU Harding Hospital Board. She attended a five-day continuing education course on Mind Body Medicine offered by Dr. Herbert Benson in 2006 and then began pursuing training in yoga as a means to help people maximize their health and functioning. She now teaches yoga at Yoga on High. The STAR Team was delighted when Dr. Szykowny joined the OSUHBH/STAR Leadership Development Board. She enthusiastically embraced both the mission and philosophy of the STAR Program, and in 2011, the Szykowny family provided initial funding for a STAR/Psychiatry Professorship. With the help of Dr. Szykowny's continuing support and leadership, the STAR Program is contributing in significant ways toward impacting both patient care and staff satisfaction at OSU Harding Behavioral Health and across the Wexner Medical Center.

The Ohio State University Stress, Trauma, and Resilience (STAR) Program is an initiative of OSU Harding Behavioral Health and the Wexner Medical Center that improves lives by developing and delivering trauma-informed clinical services and educational programs that help those suffering the ravages of trauma and related mental illness.
