Admission is free, and a portion of the proceeds from food will be donated to Arc of Ohio, an advocacy group for persons with developmental disabilities.

the outstanding debut release of The Four Mints.

Each artist performing at the Revue has a storied past dating back to the mid-'50s. Some, including headliner Syl Johnson and Marion Black, only entered back onto the stage after discovering that modern musicians—among them: RJD2, Wu-Tang Clan, and Geto Boys—had sampled the songs that they had created decades ago.
